Spooner - A high yielding winter rye. Grain yields and test weights exceed those of Hancock; heads one day earlier and has excellent winter hardiness. It is tall, averaging about 3 inches taller than Hancock with less lodging. Developed at the University of Wisconsin Madison and released in 1992. License required for production. PVP(94) Title V.

TRITICALE

NE426GT - Is a grain and fall forage winter triticale developed cooperatively by the Nebraska and Iowa Agricultural Experiment Stations. It is awned, medium-tall, early heading variety. NE426GT has moderate straw strength and has moderate resistance to stem and leaf rust. The Registered seed class is non-saleable. License agreement is required for seed production.

WINTER WHEAT

Arapahoe - A hard red winter wheat, awned, white-chaffed, medium-early, medium height. Moderately good lodging resistance, relatively high in kernel protein and test weight. Moderately resistant to current prevalent races of leaf and stem rust, moderately tolerant of Cephalosporium stripe. Released by Nebraska Agricultural Experiment Station in 1988.

Branson - A soft red winter wheat bred and developed by AgriPro Wheat. A medium height, semi-dwarf variety with good straw strength. Branson is moderately resistant to Septoria leaf blotch, stripe rust, and powdery mildew, with intermediate resistance to soil-borne mosaic virus and leaf rust. Primary adaptation is the wheat growing regions of Missouri, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, and Ohio. PVP(94) Title V.

CDC Falcon - Semi-dwarf hard red winter wheat, with high yield potential. CDC Falcon has good winter hardiness. It is a short variety with very good straw strength. CDC Falcon has good stem and leaf rust resistance. It has average protein and test weight. Released in the United States by Western Plant Breeders. PVP (94).

Darrell - A hard red winter wheat with medium maturity. Similar height to Arapahoe with better straw strength than Arapahoe. Winter survival has shown to be excellent. Yield potential is extremely high. It has good milling and average baking quality. It is resistant to stem rust and is moderately susceptible to leaf rust. It is moderately susceptible to wheat streak mosaic virus. It has good resistance to scab. It has shown good resistance to leaf spotting diseases. Developed by South Dakota Agricultural Experiment Station and released by SDAES and the Nebraska Agricultural Experiment Station in 2006. License required for seed production. PVP(94).

Expedition - Hard red winter wheat, awned, white-chaffed, early maturing, semi-dwarf. Plant height is short, winter hardiness is rated good-excellent. Straw strength is fair. Is rated resistant to prevalent races of stem rust, however, is moderately susceptible to leaf rust. Exhibits some tolerance to head scab but is susceptible to tan spot and Hessian fly and had an intermediate reaction to soil-borne mosaic virus. End-use characteristics are rated acceptable overall. Released by South Dakota Agricultural Experiment Station in 2003. PVP(94) Title V.

Ideal - A hard red winter wheat with high grain yield and adaptation to the northern winter wheat production area. It exhibits average to good milling and baking qualities, good winter hardiness and excellent resistance to lodging. Ideal is moderately susceptible to stripe rust and susceptible to head scab, but it exhibits moderate resistance to tan spot, leaf and stem rust. Released by the South Dakota Agricultural Experiment Station in 2011. License required for seed production. PVP(94) Title V is applied for.

NE01643 (Husker Genetics Overland Brand) - An awned, semi-dwarf hard red winter wheat, with moderate winter hardiness. It is medium height with good straw strength. It has average test weight and good protein. It is moderately resistant to leaf rust, stripe rust, and Hessian fly. Husker Genetics Brand Overland also is more tolerant to Fusarium head blight than many widely grown lines. Husker Genetics Brand Overland was developed cooperatively by the Nebraska Agricultural Experiment Station and the USDA-ARS. A license is required for seed production. Husker Genetics Brand Overland has no saleable registered class it can only be sold as certified seed. PVP(94) Title V.
