Have your Fields Been Inspected?

Be sure to contact your MCIA Field Supervisor if you are unsure whether a field has been inspected or if you have a field ready for harvest that has not been inspected. If the Field Supervisor is not available to speak with you directly, please leave a detailed message including your name, phone number, the field in question, along with the proposed date of harvest. They will return your call as soon as possible. See Field Supervisor contact information below in the shaded box.

Are you Labeling Your Storage Bins Correctly?

Seed producers and conditioners must properly label all bins containing seed and keep records identifying the contents of their bins. Bin storage records should include variety, field number(s), year grown, seed class and grower or lot number. Tell your contract growers to label their bins as well.

Winter Wheat and Rye Seed

Growers interested in ordering Foundation winter wheat or rye seed should contact the MCIA office. We will check on availability and request seed from other states. Order early for best availability. Along with the Certified seed samples there is a display of crops and seeds grown in Minnesota. The display area is a joint effort between the State Fair, the University of Minnesota and MCIA. It is staffed by Dr. Roy Thompson and Duane Smith (retired U of MN), Paul Mickelson (retired MCIA) and Roger Wippler. We answer questions about crops and seed and try to understand some of the comments we hear.
