Varieties Released in 2008

The following varieties were released in 2008 and are available in limited supply: Tom Spring Wheat, Rasmusson Barley and MN0105 Soybeans. All of these releases will require a license agreement and a variety development fee or royalty will be assessed.

Tom Spring Wheat

Tom is a mid-maturity hard red spring wheat with good scab tolerance. Tom has consistently been above average in grain yield with good test weight and protein. The heading date of Tom is similar to Freyr. It is average in height with medium straw strength. Tom has moderate resistance to scab, similar to Freyr. It is resistant to stem rust and moderately resistant to the Ug99 race of stem rust. It is moderately resistant to prevalent races of leaf rust and other leaf diseases. Tom is resistant to pre-harvest sprouting with good falling numbers. Released by the Minnesota Agricultural Experiment Station in 2008. License required for seed production. PVP (94) contemplated.

Rasmusson Barley

Rasmusson is a high yielding, six row malting type. It is currently undergoing a second year of quality testing by the malting and brewing industry and a satisfactory rating is expected. Rasmusson has lower grain protein and higher malt extract compared to current varieties grown in the region. Yields for Rasmusson have equaled or exceeded other varieties in three years of testing. It is slightly shorter than other varieties and has good lodging resistance. Rasmusson has a similar disease profile to all the other current Midwest varieties. The variety is named in honor of long time Minnesota barley breeder Don Rasmusson. Released by the Minnesota Agricultural Experiment Station in 2008. License required for seed production. PVP (94) contemplated.

MN0105 Soybeans

MN0105 is a 0.1 maturity conventional soybean line that carries the Rps1c gene for phytophthora resistance. It has very good yield potential. It is approximately 2 days later than Traill and slightly taller. MN0105 has good iron chlorosis tolerance. This variety has a yellow hilum and good protein content. Released by the Minnesota Agricultural Experiment station. License required for seed production.
