Varieties Released in 2009

The following varieties were released in 2009 and are available in limited supply: Sabin and Brick Spring Wheat and Colt Oats. All of these releases will require a license agreement and a variety development fee or royalty will be assessed.

Sabin Spring Wheat

Sabin, developed by the University of Minnesota, is a medium maturity hard red spring wheat with good scab tolerance. In testing, Sabin has consistently been above average in grain yield with excellent performance in southern locations. It has good test weight and protein with good milling and baking qualities. The heading date of Sabin is similar to Freyr. It is average in height with medium straw strength. Sabin has the Sumai 3 source for scab resistance rating of 4 (on 1-9 scale), similar to Faller and Freyr. It is resistant to stem rust, with moderate resistance to leaf rust and moderate resistance to other leaf diseases.

Brick Spring Wheat

Brick, is an early maturing hard red spring wheat with high yield potential and excellent test weight. Released by the South Dakota Agricultural Experiment Station, Brick is 1-2 days earlier than Briggs. It is slightly taller than average with medium straw strength. It has good protein, high test weight and good baking qualities. Brick has very good scab tolerance, using the Sumai 3 source of resistance; with good resistance to stem and leaf rust. The name Brick represents its dark color and heavy test weight.

Colt Oats

Colt is an early oat variety released by the South Dakota Agricultural Experiment Station. In Minnesota trials Colt was the earliest variety to head. The yields for Colt are equal to Kame while Colt headed 1-2 days earlier than Kame. Colt has a better lodging rating than Kame; both are shorter varieties similar in height. Colt is a white oat with very good test weight. Colt is smut resistant with crown rust rating slightly better than Kame with a comparable rating for Barley yellow dwarf virus.
